
### Building Our Children's Future, One Program at a Time

With more than 75% of the families of school-age children in the workforce, afterschool program are a vital partner with families, schools and communities to assure safety and success of children and youth. In Wisconsin afterschool programs; keep children and youth safe, support working families and support academic achievement.

In November of 2015, Marshfield Clinic and the Wisconsin Afterschool Network (WAN) started a mapping process to identify afterschool programs throughout Wisconsin. Over 530 individual surveys were completed representing over 650 afterschool programs.




